

2024 Out & About in Our Community Regular Outing (Excursion) Permission

Throughout the preschool year, each class will go on a range of walks out and about in the community. This may include visits to the local park, shops, beach, library or primary school. We may go to a location further away and go via public transport (train or bus) or private bus for part of our journey. Our outings will provide opportunities for many different discussions that may include but not limited to road safety, the local environment (built and natural) and our community.

We may travel up to five kilometers from the preschool. There may be occasions when we ask parents to meet us at the location and we will walk back to the preschool for the remainder of the session.

For spontaneous outings, parents will be informed via the Storypark app and a sign in the foyer next to the sign-in book on the day of the outing. For activities that are planned further in advance, information may be available via communication pockets, newsletters, Storypark app and signs in the foyer. If additional adults are required, we will ask families to sign up on the sheet next to the sign-in book.

Each outing will include up to 33 children (all preschool children present on the day). The minimum educator to child ratio will always be maintained with at least 1 adult to 11 children. All volunteers participating in any excursion will be under the direct supervision of a member of staff while assisting in the supervision and care of the children.

A risk assessment has been prepared as per Department of Education & Care Services National Regulations 100 and is available at the preschool.
